

West Allis Health Department School Health Services For Families

Dental Health Services:

A Dental Hygienist provides dental screening, education, and resource information. A school based dental fluoride varnishing program is provided at all public grade schools.

Vision and Hearing Screening:

Health Screening Technicians perform vision and hearing screenings every year in the schools for specific grades. Individual screenings are also available upon request.

Communicable Disease:

Public health nurses provide education and counseling on a variety of communicable diseases.

Immunization:

Clinics are available on a Walk in basis or by appointment. Call the West Allis Health Department or visit our website for specific information. Flu clinics are offered during flu season.

Parenting Classes:

"Love and Logic" Parenting Classes are offered twice each year by Public Health Nurses. Call the West Allis Health Department or visit our website for specific information.

Health Information and Community Resources:

A Public Health Nurse is available Monday – Friday, 8:00 am – 5:00 pm by phone, home or clinic visit to answer health related questions and help with finding resources.

Health Education Services:

A Health Educator is available to schools to provide programs on health topics in the classroom.

Asthma Home Walkthrough Program*:

A Public Health Nurse is available upon request for an Asthma Home Walkthrough to identify asthma triggers and provide suggestions for improved asthma control.

Promotoras:

Spanish speaking community health workers are available to assist families with finding community resources.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT VACCINATIONS

If your child is insured, please make an appointment with your primary care provider for vaccinations.

If your child is *Vaccines for Children (VFC)* eligible, you can continue to visit your local health department for vaccinations.

Who is VFC eligible?

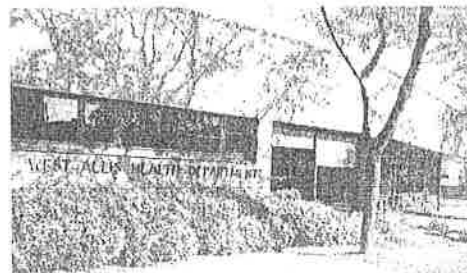
Children through 18 years of age who are:

- Medicaid eligible or enrolled
- Uninsured
- American Indian or Alaska Native
- Underinsured (has health insurance, but the coverage does not include all vaccines or only covers selected vaccines. Speak with your private insurance company to check if your plan covers vaccines.)

IMPORTANT!

PLEASE NOTE

- All immunization records **MUST** be brought to each clinic.
- Parent or legal guardian **MUST** sign for children's immunizations on Public Health Division forms. Legal Guardian must bring legal guardianship papers.

IMPORTANT NOTE

Although this may be temporary, adults and children needing DTaP or Tdap (a vaccine protecting against pertussis or whooping cough) may still receive them at your local health department, regardless of insurance status.
